FARMS AND BARNS OF BUCKS COUNTY Topic of May Meeting

The May meeting of the Northampton Township Historical Society will feature a talk on FARMS AND BARNS OF BUCKS COUNTY by RICHARD B. NEWMAN, an historian and photographer from Newtown Township.

During the early 1980's, while holding the position of County Manager, Bucks County, Mr. Newman had the opportunity to traverse Bucks County from north to south and east to west during the period of major population growth and the advent of many housing developments within the county. It was during this time that he noticed the disappearance of several farms and, in their place, the creation of numerous communities where not long before cultivated earth had produced its bounty or open fields beckoned the eye of the beholder. A meeting was arranged with the Penn State Agricultural Agent in Doylestown. From this meeting Mr. Newman learned that during the previous two decades approximately 300 farms disappeared every five years, so, that by 1985 less than 900 working farms remained in Bucks County. Most of those were quite small. During the past 10 years almost a dozen farms have disappeared within a radius of 5 miles of Newtown Borough.

During the two years it took to research data, collect information, photograph the farms and interview the owners or tenants, Mr. Newman traveled 7,000 miles, and took more than 3,500 pictures (125+ rolls of color 35mm film) of 500 farms in Bucks County. To Photograph the farms and barns Mr. Newman used a NIKON camera body with a Tokina 35-105mm zoom lens, a Tamron 70-210mm zoom lens, a Tamron 500mm mirror lens, a Nikor 35mm PC lens and a Nikor 28mm lens. The photographs of farms/barns shown in Mr. Newman's display will appear in his book "FARMS & BARNS OF BUCKS COUNTY."

Mr. Newman discovered a unique beauty and heritage which is being eroded by pressure from a continuing population growth. There were more than 2000 farms.....and then there were none.

The Bucks County Conservancy, The Bucks County Historical Society, numerous libraries, including Pennsbury Manor, were helpful in providing information or permitting research in their facility and Independent researcher and teacher, Kathy Auerbach, provided guidance in the project.

The meeting will start at 7:30 PM on Wednesday, May 21 at the Northampton Township Cultural Center, adjacent to the library, Upper Holland Road, Richboro. Visitors are always welcome. Please plan to join us for a great program.
