The bookstore owner requested them, in different variations in dress color for seasons and holidays and friends and other customers requested multiple skin tones. CHURCHVILLE TRAIN STATION GLOWING AGAIN

The historic Churchville train station was recently renovated thanks to a grant from the state of Pennsylvania and Representative Roy Reinard. The project was supervised by Society board member Diane Amadio. Diane did a wonderful job of making the \$5000 grant go a long way. The station, built in 1892, served for many years as a stop on the Newtown branch of the Reading Railroad. Service on the line was terminated in the 1980's. The station also served for many years as the Churchville postoffice. Owned by SEPTA, it has been rented for many years to an individual who maintains the inside. Articles on the renovation appeared in both the Courier Times and the Advance newspapers. Again many thanks to Diane for a job well done!
